What Is The OEI?

- Proposal for increasing access and success through online instruction funded through the Governor's request
- ♦ \$56.9 million over 55 months
 - \$16.9 million Dec 2013 through June 2014
 - \$10 million July 2014 through June 2015
 - \$10 million/year for three years afterward
 - Sponsored by Foothill/DeAnza District in partnership with Butte College
