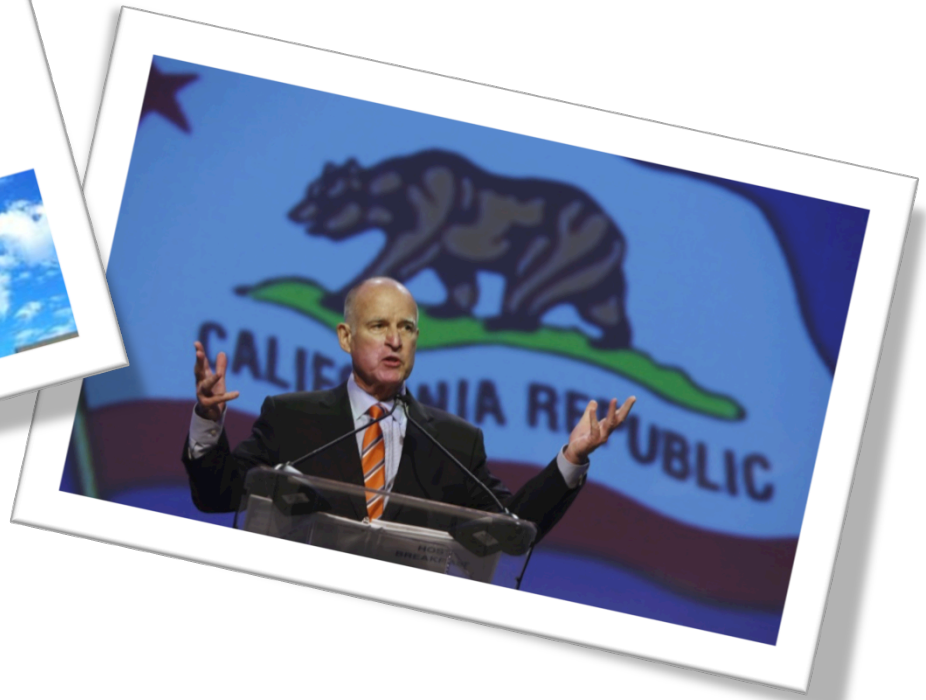

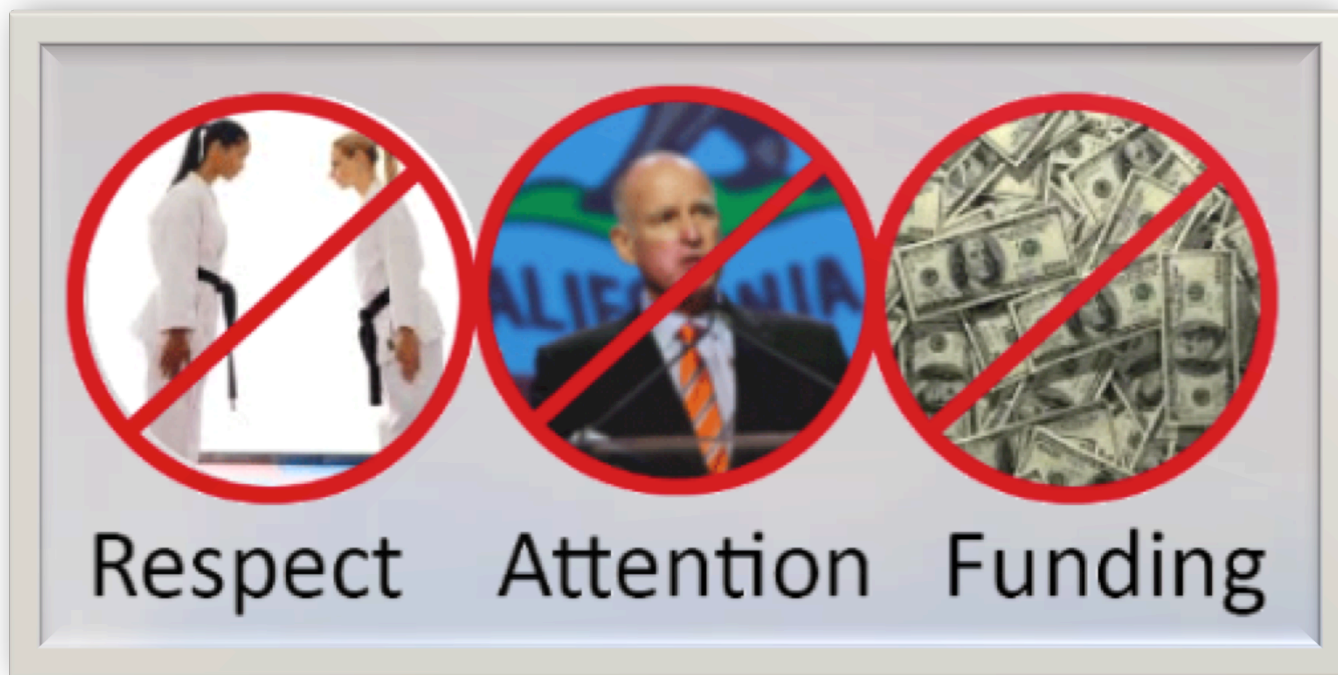
Deep cuts to California's community college system mean the state may turn away 670,000 students, according to a report from the state's community colleges.

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What Is The OEI?

- ◆ Proposal for increasing access and success through online instruction funded through the Governor's request
- ◆ \$56.9 million over 55 months
 - ◆ \$16.9 million – Dec 2013 through June 2014
 - ◆ \$10 million – July 2014 through June 2015
 - ◆ \$10 million/year for three years afterward
 - ◆ Sponsored by Foothill/DeAnza District in partnership with Butte College
