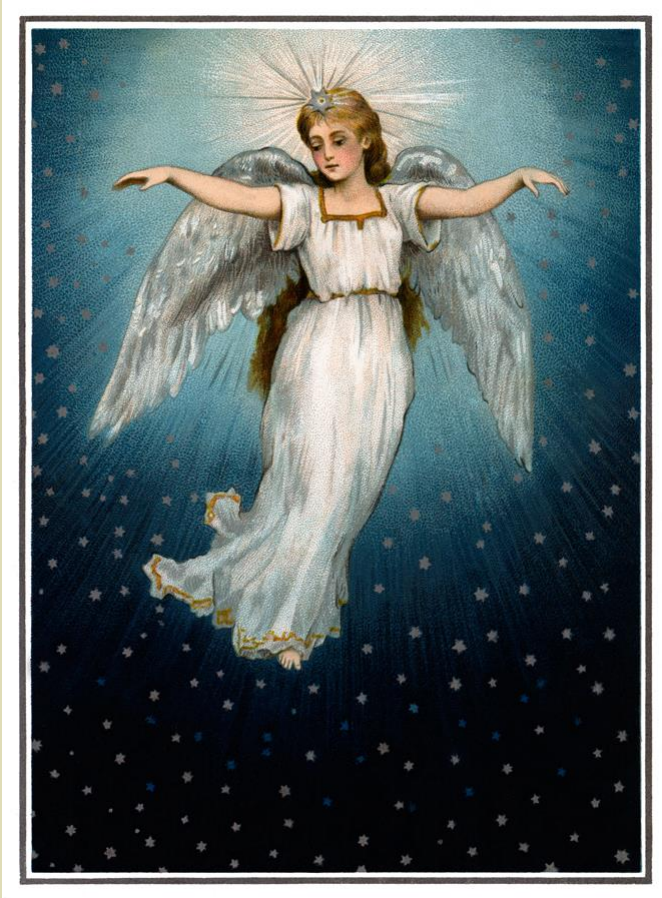

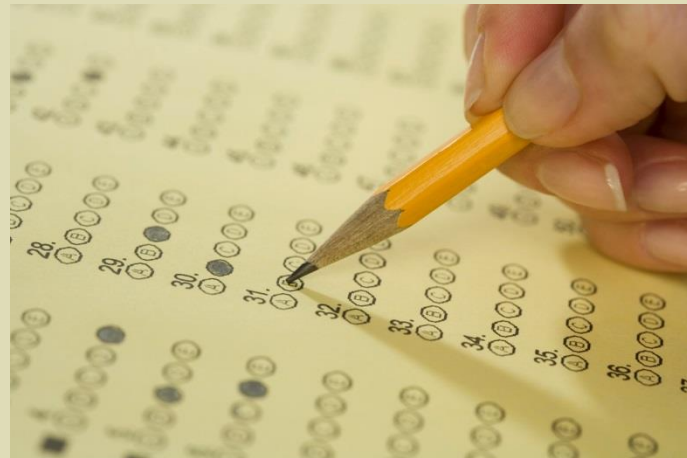

So what can we do?

The following can be done for show of “good cause”:

Ed. Code § 76032

- Instructors can remove a student (1 day & next class meeting)

Ed. Code § 76031

College presidents can suspend students:

- From one or more classes up to 10 days
- From one or more classes for remainder of term
- From all classes & activities for one or more terms

Ed Code § 76030

The Board of Trustees can expel students:

- From all colleges in the district permanently

What is good cause?

Ed Code § 76033

Good cause includes but is not limited to the language in this section.

- Do's & don'ts embedded in each assignment
- Consistent enforcement
- Rationale for why it is important
 - Disturbing learning environment for others
 - Devalues worth of degrees
 - 4-year transfer institutions' expectations
 - Workplace expectations
 - Societal laws and ethics
