
Using the Outcomes Feature in Canvas.

Using data to drive our decisions as we evaluate our Canvas courses may be one of the most important strategies we can employ. But, where do we get data that is clear and easy to interpret and utilize? In this workshop, we will discuss the value, configuration and use of Outcomes and Rubrics to align our assignments with the course SLO's and use the outcome data to tweak our courses for the future.



Outcomes:

By the end of this sessions you will be able to integrate the Outcomes feature into your Course.



Use Outcomes to:

- Focus students' attention on the most important skills and activities in your course (find existing outcomes or create new ones)
- Align Quizzes and Assignments to different kinds of mastery
- Run reports at the account-level about student artifacts of learning mastery
- Assess student progress through calculation methods
- Track student progress on a learning outcome or overall in the Learning Mastery Gradebook
- Align accreditation or other core standards to programs of study, courses, or student assessments
